Dear Sir:

The amount payable under this section was increased by Chapter 793 of the Acts of 1972 from \$1,500.00 to \$1,680.00.

This is one of the few sections providing for annuities or payments which is not subject to acceptance by a City or Town. Therefore, benefits payable under this section should be in the amount of \$1,680.00.

This amount also applies to widows who are already receiving an allowance prior to January 1, 1973 and their payments should be increased in accordance with this section.

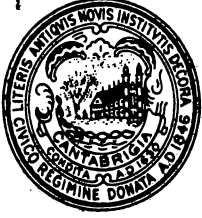

Dear Mr. Corcoran:

You have asked my opinion whether the above named may receive an annuity under General Laws, Chapter 32, Section 101 as well as her own pension. Section 101 provides in part as follows: "Any allowance which such widow may be receiving or any allowance which she may have potential rights to receive, based on her own service to the Commonwealth or any political subdivision thereof, shall not make her ineligible to receive the allowance provided in this section."

Provided that her late husband was retired for accidental disability, Mrs. Andella would be entitled to her own pension as well as an annuity under Section 101 in the amount of \$1,200.00 per year.
