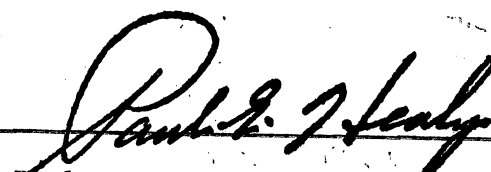

- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Anna Kozlowsky, a life-long Cantabrigian and late career employee of the Treasurer's Office of the Commonwealth; and
- WHEREAS: Anna worked for the Commonwealth for forty-four years, serving under thirteen governors and an equal number of state treasurers, retiring in 1980 under Robert Q. Crane, who, when notifying the legislature of Anna's retirement from state service disrupted the proceedings of the day to give her a standing ovation for her many years of faithful service to not only the state employees, but to the members of the legislature who came to know Anna as "their paymaster"; and
- WHEREAS: The death of Anna Kozlowsky will leave a large void in the life of her sister Helene and brother Alfred, as well as her many friends and colleagues in state government; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Helene Kozlowsky and to the entire Kozlowsky family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Helene Kozlowsky on behalf of the entire City Council.
