of the City of Cambridge:

The undersigned respectfully
represents, that by the widening
of Spruce St. in the year
1870, the well of water upon
premises of the estate of
Catherine Gallivan was thrown
outside the then established
line of fence, and upon the
sidewalk - that by order of
last year, the pump to the
same was removed, thereby
leaving the estate without
water; and this contrary to
an understanding supposed by
her to exist, that the Cession

of land for purpose of
widening street, a new
well would be supplied
by the City: And your
petitioner being without the
pecuniary means of supplying
the deficiency, and made,
in consequence, dependent
upon her neighbors for a
necessary of life, respectfully
asks that she be relieved,
as in justice she feels ~~she~~
