WHEREAS: The safety of all who use our city's streets is of utmost importance to this City Council; and

WHEREAS: Residents driving in the area of Brookline Street have reported turning on to that street only to be faced with a garbage collection vehicle approaching them from the wrong way down that one-way street; and

WHEREAS: This practice causes alarm to drivers who are obeying the laws, and has the potential to become a significant safety hazard; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to investigate and correct the practice of garbage trucks driving the wrong way down one-way streets -- no matter for how short a distance -- and report back to this City Council within two weeks.

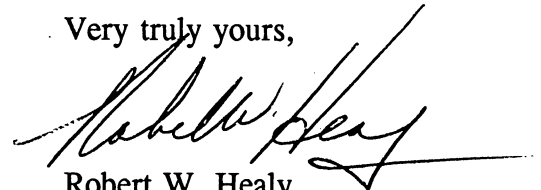
