Please be advised the Public Works Department is studying the drainage problem in the New Street area.

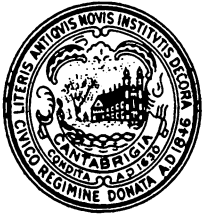
The major problem appears to be the flooding behind the Indikon Company (formerly Columbia Corners Property). This resulted in a pumping station put in by the City on private property approximately eight years ago. It appears now that major renovations must be done to this pumping station because of increased drainage problems.

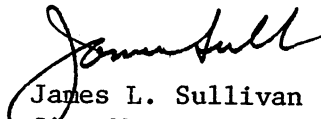
