Application of Teltrust Communications Services, Inc., under the provisions of Chapter 159 of the General laws, as amended, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a resale, value-added common carrier within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. The Applicant, a corporation organized under Utah laws, plans to offer direct dial "+1" toll, 800 number, and debit card services in Massachusetts on an intrastate and interstate basis. All services will be available twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week.

Comments, objections and requests for a public hearing on the proposed service must be made in writing with specific reasons for requesting a public hearing, and filed with the Secretary of the Department on or before April 28, 1994.

The petitioner, Teltrust Communications Services, Inc., is required to complete the following: (1) Give notice by publication hereof once, on or before April 14, 1994 [which is twenty-one (21) days prior to May 5, 1994], in the Boston Globe, the Morning Union (Springfield), the Berkshire Eagle (Pittsfield) and the Worcester Telegram; (2) Give notice by mailing a copy hereof on or before April 14, 1994 to the Local Exchange and Other Common Carriers on the attached Interexchange Carriers list; and (3) Make return of service and publication no later than May 12, 1994.
