of the City of Cambridge,

The undersigned respectfully prays that an obstruction in
Dollard Place, a ~~way~~ leading out of Putnam
Avenue, now and for many years past an
open travelable way, for any accident in which
the City would be liable, may be removed,
the same being a nuisance to persons having
occasion to travel in said Place, and a
source of liability to the City.

Said obstruction consists of a plank $\frac{3}{4}$ inch
to a foot standing in the edge of the sidewalk
and to the fence on the inside of the sidewalk
said plank projecting about six inches above
the sidewalk.
