In Board of Aldermen, Dec. 1st 1868.

Whereas it is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that Ellery Street, so called, from Clean Street to Harvard Street, be laid out as a public way,

Ordered, That said Ellery Street be and hereby is laid out and established as a public way, by the name of Ellery Street, agreeably to a Plan thereof drawn by the City Engineers, bearing date of Sept. 22. 1868, and now on file in the office of the City Clerk, to wit, from Clean Street to Harvard Street, the same to be forty feet in width, as shown by the red lines showing extent on said Plan.

Ordered, That no damages be awarded to the persons over whose land said Ellery Street is laid out as aforesaid.

Ordered, That six months be allowed to the persons over whose land said Street is laid out for the removal of their trees, fences, and other property, lying within the limits of the way, as laid out as aforesaid.
