


To the Honorable, the City Council:

On February 28, 1977, the City Council appropriated \$20,000.00 for a pilot program to process parking tickets with a private computer firm. At that time it was agreed upon by representatives from the Traffic & Parking Department, the Third District Clerk of Court's Office and my staff, that the existing practice of having the City of Boston's Data Processing Department process the tickets was no longer feasible.

It is now the opinion of all concerned with the collection and processing of parking fines that the City should continue with this program. In addition to more timely and efficient processing of the tickets, the City has been provided with a Tow and Hold list which has been used by the Traffic and Police Departments to tow those violators who have failed to pay their fines. The cost of extending this program is \$120,000.00, with the revenue to come from the Parking Fund. It is a program which will more than pay for itself.

Passage of this appropriation is strongly recommended.
