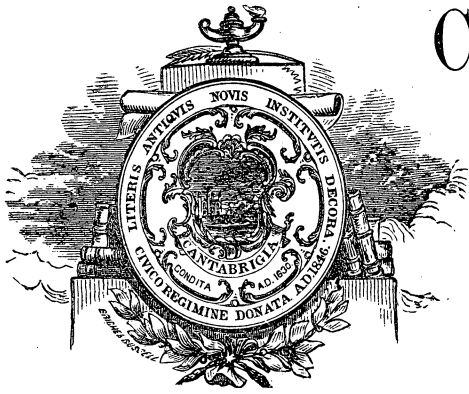




CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN,

October 18th 1871

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that

Green Street
from *Brookline Street* to *Sidney Street*

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land
feet in width between

Forty
Brookline & Sidney Streets

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by

Mason & Elliot Civil Engineers and dated
May 16th 1871

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid.

Ordered, That thirty days be allowed
to the persons whose land is taken, for
the removal of fences standing on
the land ^{so taken} as aforesaid

Accepted. Same deemed for concurrence.
