The housing package will allow local housing authorities to contract with a single private developer to build a complete housing development, and

WHEREAS:

Some seventeen local housing authorities within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts have already provided some sixty-seven hundred new housing units through the Turnkey program, therefore be it
