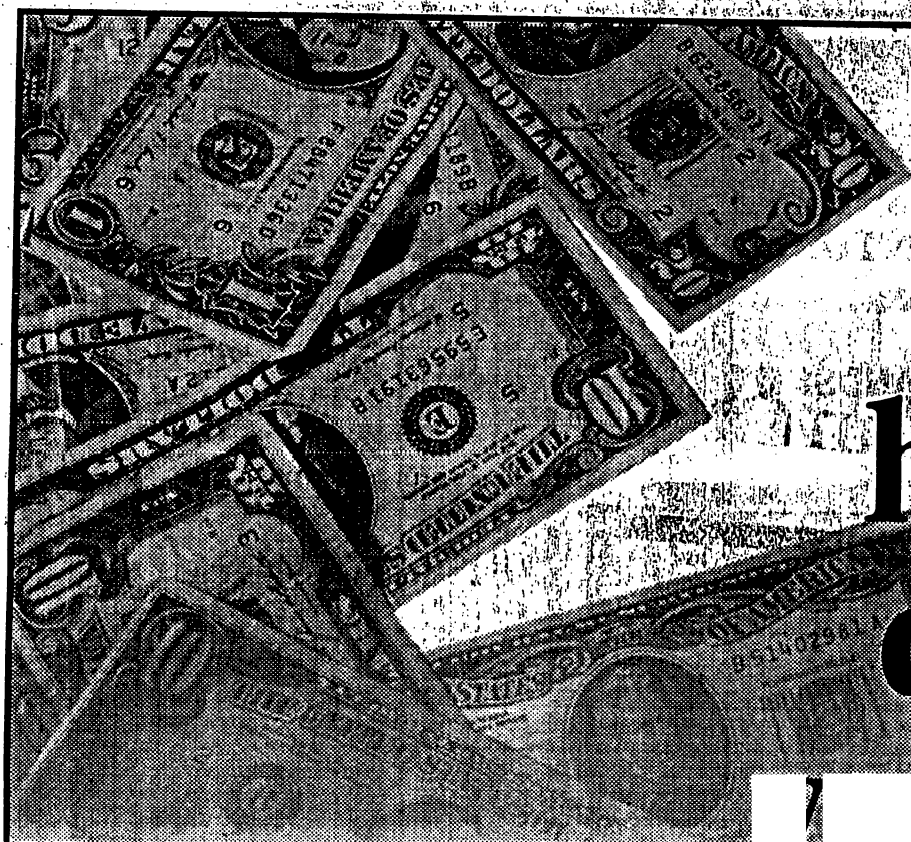
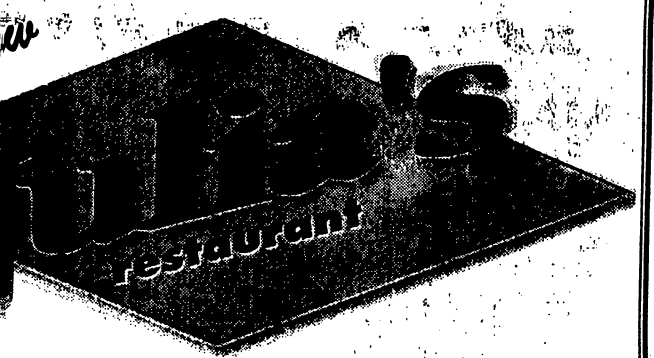
Ellen F. Crawley
