On January 23, 1989 the City Council ordered me to "provide a special area on application forms which will allow the applicant to designate their senior/elderly status, and to create a mechanism whereby these applications are given priority in processing." In response to the order, we have taken the following steps:

1. The master petitions for Regulation 72, 75 and 76 Rent Adjustments have been changed to allow petitioners to indicate whether they are 65 years old or older in the area immediately above the signature line, and
2. The staff has been instructed to prioritize petitions where the petitioner is a senior citizen.
