- WHEREAS: It was with profound sorrow that this City Council learned of the passing of Richard D. Gerould, former City Solicitor of Cambridge, on November 17, 1979 at the age of seventy-five years; and
- WHEREAS: Richard D. Gerould received his Bachelors Degree from Harvard University in 1924 and graduated from Harvard Law School in 1927 and was admitted to the practice of law in the Courts of the Commonwealth in the same year; and
- WHEREAS: Richard D. Gerould was a lifelong resident of the University City who achieved great stature in the practice of law, serving his native city as City Solicitor from August 25, 1952 to August 30, 1965 when his outstanding talents were recognized by the Justices of the Supreme Court of Massachusetts by his appointment to the position of Executive Secretary of the State Judicial Court; and
- WHEREAS: Richard Dodge Gerould earned the respect of his colleagues by his research and preparation which he combined with a precise and clear presentation of facts which resulted in many favorable decisions in litigation in both the private and public sectors; and
- WHEREAS: That in the death of Richard D. Gerould, the City of Cambridge and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts have lost a conscientious and loyal public official who represented the highest ideals of public service; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council joins with the family and friends of Richard D. Gerould in sorrow of their loss and extends its sympathy and hope for comfort to those who were near him; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is directed to have a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution delivered to the family of Richard D. Gerould in token of our sympathy.
