

In Metropolitan District Commission  
Boston, Mass., April 1, 1954

ORDERED that, on petition of Boston Edison Company dated March 8, 1954, for locations shown on plan of Boston Edison Company dated January 29, 1954, and indexed accession number 32357X, for pipes, manholes, wires and cables for the transmission of electricity for light, heat and power and intelligence by electricity under and across the Charles River and Soldiers Field Road at Cambridge Street, Boston (Brighton District), and Memorial Drive at River Street, Cambridge, said Soldiers Field, Charles River and Memorial Drive being boulevards under the care and control of this Commission, said locations having been found by order of the Department of Public Utilities to be required by public convenience and necessity, said plan and petition being on file in the office of this Commission, a hearing on said petition having been given by this Commission on Thursday, April 1, 1954, at 2 P.M., at the office of the Commission in Boston, of which hearing due notice was given to all persons interested of the time and place by publishing a copy of said petition and the order of notice issued thereon by this Commission in newspapers published in the Cities of Boston and Cambridge, being the cities in which the locations petitioned for would lie, the first publication having been made at least fourteen days prior to the date of said hearing, and it appearing, in the opinion of this Commission that public convenience and necessity so require, said Boston Edison Company is hereby granted locations for said pipes, manholes, wires and cables in said Charles River, Soldiers Field Road and Memorial Drive to the extent and upon the terms, conditions and obligations hereinafter specified, the same being such as the public necessity and a due regard for the rights of the Commonwealth require, namely:-

1. The Boston Edison Company shall conform to all provisions of law applicable to the exercise of the rights and performance of the

work under this grant and to the rules and regulations of the Metropolitan District Commission.

2. The Boston Edison Company shall do the work of installing said pipes, manholes, wires and cables in the locations hereby granted subject to the approval of the Director of Park Engineering of the Commission as to time, manner and location and in all other respects.

3. Said Boston Edison Company shall indemnify and save harmless the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the Metropolitan District Commission from any damage it or they may sustain or be required to pay arising out of the exercise by said Company of the rights hereby granted or by reason of any negligence by said Company or any of its employees in connection with the work done hereunder.

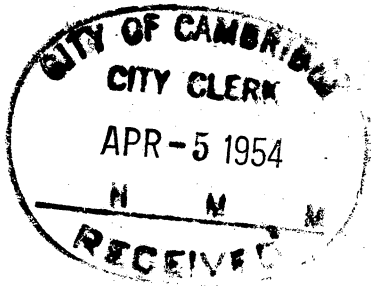
4. Said Boston Edison Company shall protect and maintain all trees, drainage or water pipes, and all appurtenances or structures either above or below the surface of the ground over which the location lies, and upon completion of the work shall restore the surface of the ground to the condition in which it was at the time of this grant and in a manner satisfactory to said Director of Park Engineering of the Commission, and shall maintain the surface of the ground and the location throughout in such condition to the satisfaction of said Director.

5. The Boston Edison Company shall place and maintain proper barriers at all times and from the beginning of twilight through the whole of every night sufficient lights to protect the public from injury or damage during the progress of the work under this grant or during repairs upon said pipes, manholes, wires and cables and work on the location which may hereafter become necessary.

6. No work shall be done under this grant without first ob-

taining a permit therefor from said Director of Park Engineering and subject to conditions imposed by him.

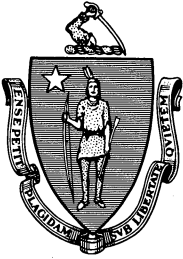

Please acknowledge, on the enclosed carbon copy, your receipt of said copy of order.

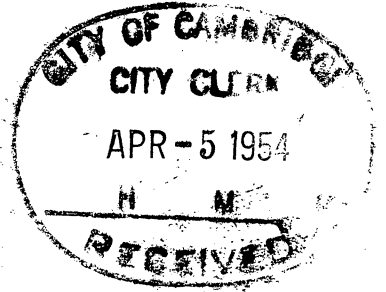
