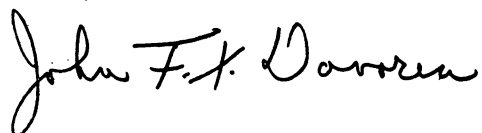

ARTICLES OF ORGANIZATION

2. The Corporation is organized and shall be generated exclusively to promote, foster and improve and develop all levels of media education both visual and aural as is or is to be found in the role of human communication by all methods including but not limited to film workshops, festivals, film making and production, development of visual aids and slide techniques, seminars, conferences, educational institutes and courses of instructions, television production, publication of printed materials and all other things reasonable necessary to achieve the afore described aims of the corporation.

The Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, education, and scientific purposes including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations under section 501 (C) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or the corresponding provision of any future United States Revenue law (hereinafter referred to as the Code). The Corporation shall operate as an independent, non-profit voluntary membership organization. No part of its assets, income or property shall be distributable to or inure to the private benefit of any member, director, officer or other individual, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for bonafide services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Two hereof. No substantial part of its activities shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation and it shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles the corporation shall not except an insubstantial degree engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purpose of this corporation.

The Directors, Officers, and members shall not accept any inheritances, bequests, gifts or donations which carry with it any oral or written instructions not in conformity with the preceeding paragraphs and shall return same when and if offered.

In the event of termination or dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for payment of its liabilities, dispose all its remaining assets exclusively for education and charitable purposes. As at that time qualify as an organization or organizations under section 501 (C) (3) of the Code in such manner as the Board of Directors shall determine. The Corporation shall petition the Superior Court (of the County of which the principal office of the corporation is then located) for a ruling on any asset not so disposed of or in the event of inability of the Board of Directors to agree as to distribution of any amount or type of asset.

If the Corporation at any time is deemed to be a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509 of the Code, then for the period in which it is so deemed, it shall distribute its income for each taxable year in such manner and at such times as not to be subject to tax under Section 4942 of the Code; and the Corporation shall be prohibited from engaging in any act of self dealing which is taxable under Section 4941 of said Code, from retaining any excess business holdings (as defined in Section 4943 (C) of said Code), from making any investments in such manner as to subject the Corporation to tax under Section 4944 of the Code, and from any taxable expenditures (as defined in Section 4945 (d) of the Code).

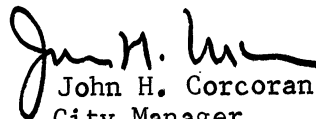
