## IN CITY COUNCIL

COUNCILLOR WALSH

**WHEREAS:** Automobile security alarms are set off by attempted theft or, as is often the case, by a malfunction within the auto's electrical system, and when left untended for an extended period of time, the sound of the alarm becomes an unacceptable noise within the neighborhood area adjacent to where the auto in question is located; now therefore be it

**ORDERED:** That the City Manager direct the City Solicitor to draft the appropriate addendum to Chapter 8.16.150 , Noise, of the Cambridge Municipal Code so as to include as a violation thereof the noise emanating from an automobile's security alarm when that alarm has been sounding for a period of time in excess of thirty (30) minutes and penalty applicable thereto for each offense be directed against the registered owner of said automobile; and be it further

**ORDERED:** That, by September 25, 1989, the City Manager report back to the City Council to confirm that this process is underway.
