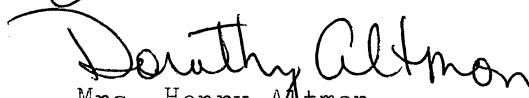
The League of Women Voters of Cambridge is seriously concerned that the Election Commission has decided that the issue of rent control not be on the ballot in November.
