- WHEREAS: The American Cancer Society promotes the public health through its educational programs to inform people about the hazards of smoking, and
- WHEREAS: An estimated 2,800 new cases of lung cancer are expected to occur in this Commonwealth in 1978, and
- WHEREAS: Approximately 2,600 Massachusetts residents will die of lung cancer in 1978, and
- WHEREAS: As least 80 percent of lung cancer can be attributed to cigarette smoking, and
- WHEREAS: The American Cancer Society has reaffirmed its commitment to education, research, and anti-smoking clinics, now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That I, Thomas W. Danehy, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, do hereby proclaim November 16, 1978 as the Great American Smokeout, and urge citizens of Cambridge to support the anti-smoking efforts of the American Cancer Society by pledging to give up cigarettes, pipes, and cigars on that day.
