WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that Marsha Cannon, Postmaster of the Cambridge Post Office, has arranged for a commemoration of the recently issued Cinco de Mayo stamp to take place in Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: A brilliantly colored stamp, designed by artist Robert Rodriguez of Pasadena California and capturing the festive spirit of Cinco de Mayo celebrations, was issued by the U.S. Postal Service on April 17th; and

WHEREAS: The Cinco de Mayo holiday celebrates a military victory of Mexican troops over the French in 1862 and has become a symbol of Mexican unity and patriotism; and

WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge as well as the Cambridge Postal Service want to celebrate this important day for Mexico and for anyone of Mexican heritage in Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: Postmaster Cannon has planned this event with the assistance of the Cambridge Postal Customer Advisory Group and promises music, dancing, and chips and salsa courtesy of Central Square's Picante' Restaurant, on the steps of the Post Office across the street from this City Hall tomorrow, Tuesday May 5, 1998 from 11:00 AM to 3:00 PM; and

WHEREAS: The Postal Service will also offer for sale a limited number of special postcards with the Cinco de Mayo stamp and a unique cancellation postmark during the festivities; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record expressing its appreciation to Marsha Cannon and all the employees of the Cambridge Post Office for honoring the diversity of Cambridge with this Cinco de Mayo celebration; and go on record urging that any and all citizens join in this festive occasion; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation to Marsha Cannon, Postmaster of Cambridge, on behalf of the entire City Council.
