**LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION HONORS
CITY OF CAMBRIDGE AND CHIEF ADMINISTRATOR**

WASHINGTON, DC--The International City/County Management Association (ICMA) has announced that City Manager Robert W. Healy, Jr., and the city of Cambridge, Mass. (pop. 95,800), are the recipients of this year's ICMA Award for Excellence in Programs for the Disadvantaged.

Established in memory of Carolyn Keane, this ICMA award is given to the local government and its chief administrator who have made substantial contributions to enhancing the quality of life for the disadvantaged, including the homeless and AIDS victims. The award was presented at a luncheon on September 25, 1991, during ICMA's Annual Conference in Boston, Mass.

Committed to serving all citizens of Cambridge, Mr. Healy lead the city in establishing a MultiService Center to help the homeless obtain housing or shelter. The center also assists clients in identifying health care options, education and employment training opportunities, and substance abuse counseling.

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The city spends approximately \$150,000 annually in general funds for rental of the MultiService Center facility and for administrative and planning staff. Co-housed agencies are provided with space, utilities, telephones, a photocopier, and a receptionist at no charge. Approximately \$70,000 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) public service funds are also utilized for staffing and related costs. Resources from state contracts, providers of homeless services utilizing CDBG and McKinney Emergency Shelter Grant funds, and a substantial, privately-raised Fund for Housing the Homeless are also available.

Every three months, approximately 200 to 250 individuals receive service from the center. The interagency multiservice model services is adaptable to other geographic and service areas.

Founded in 1914, the International City/County Management Association is the professional and educational association for more than 7,600 appointed administrators and assistant administrators serving cities, counties, councils of governments, and other local governments around the world.
