## Rev. Walter Mullally, retired college educator

The Rev. Walter Bernard Mullally, O.S.B., of Manchester, N.H., biology department chairman, athletic director and educator at St. Anselm College in Manchester, N.H., for 28 years before his retirement in 1974, died Sunday at home after a long illness. He was 81.

He was born in Cambridge, he resided at St. Anselm Abbey in Manchester for more than 50 years.

Rev. Mullally graduated from St. John's High School in Cambridge in 1926 and received his bachelor's degree from Boston College in 1930. He tutored Harvard undergraduates in Latin for several years.

In 1938, he entered St. Anselm as a novice. He became a Benedictine monk in 1943 and was ordained a priest later that year in the Cathedral of the Holy Cross in Boston.

In 1946, he received a master's degree in biology from Catholic University in Washington, D.C. and later pursued advanced research work in

marine biology at Wood's Hole Oceanographical Institute in Falmouth.

He served as chairman of the St. Anselm biology department for 10 years and was director of athletics at the college from 1949 to 1960. He later became faculty moderator of athletics at the college.

Rev. Mullally was a member of the "Barry's Corner Group," an informal neighborhood association in North Cambridge that included former U.S. House Speaker Tip O'Neill. The group met once a year to play cards and reminisce.

He is survived by nine nieces and nephews and 25 grand-nieces and grand-nephews.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated for Rev. Mullally at 11 a.m. tomorrow at the St. Anselm Abbey Upper Church, St. Anselm Abby, Manchester.

Burial will be in St. Leander Cemetery, Manchester.
