WHEREAS:-

The Comprehensive City Demonstration Program for the First Action Year (hereinafter referred to as the "Comprehensive Program") for the Inner Neighborhood of the City of Cambridge was approved by resolution adopted May 9, 1969; and

WHEREAS:-

A grant agreement with the United States of America was executed on August 1, 1969 providing for Federal financial assistance under Title I of the Demonstration Cities and Metropolitan Development Act of 1966; and

WHEREAS:-

The submission to the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development (hereinafter called the "Secretary") of a proposed Second Year Action Program, amending the said Comprehensive Program, was authorized by resolution adopted May 27, 1970; and

WHEREAS:-

The submission to the Secretary of a proposed Third Year Action Program, amending the said Comprehensive Program, was authorized by resolution adopted August 16, 1971; and

WHEREAS:-

The necessary approvals for the submission of a Fourth Action Year Program by General Ordinance 766 of the City of Cambridge have been secured in a manner corresponding to the provisions of an Executive Order dated June 14, 1971 which revisited a reorganization plan for the City Demonstration Agency of the City of Cambridge dated June 14, 1971; and

WHEREAS:-

The submission to the Secretary of a proposed Fourth Year Action Program, amending the said Comprehensive Program, was authorized by resolution adopted October 16, 1972; and

WHEREAS:-

The Secretary has approved the First, Second, Third and Fourth Year Action Programs and has rendered a revised budget grant providing for the additional Fourth Year grant and said budget has been accepted by the City Manager, and

WHEREAS:-

Subsequent to full federal funding of the Fourth Action Year of the Cambridge Model Cities Comprehensive Program, a transmittal memorandum from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development served notice to officials of this City that further funding of the program would not be forthcoming due to changing Administrative policy decisions; and

WHEREAS:-

Undue hardship would result from the premature cessation of program activities planned for operation through the calendar year 1974; and

WHEREAS:-

The Congress of the United States legislated for a Five Year Demonstration Program; and

WHEREAS:-

By recent action in Committee and in regular session both Houses of Congress have voted to continue the Model Cities Program for an additional year; and

WHEREAS:-

The provisions of the House passed version to extend Model Cities differs from that of the Senate as to both the final dollar appropriation, as well as to anti-impoundment measures; and

WHEREAS:-

In order to resolve the differences in the legislation, Congress will return both versions of the legislation to a Conference Committee;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT: The City Council of Cambridge urges the Congressional Conference to recommend final legislation which will provide funding of the Model Cities Program in an amount which will allow fulfillment of the program's original goals, and that not only the City

of Cambridge but the other Model Cities Program throughout the country may complete their 5-year demonstration period; and

FURTHERMORE:-

The City Council of Cambridge urges Congress to adopt whatever measures it deems necessary to provide anti-impoundment provisions either as an integral part of any legislation to extend the Model Cities Program or by separate and general legislation.

ORDERED:

That until such time as there is proposed and approved a Comprehensive Plan for the future physical and economic development of the City of Cambridge, which in its implementation provides for a tax base which both encourages Cambridge residents and industry to remain in the city or to relocate into the city and provides the financial resources to preserve, protect and improve our neighborhoods and provide for the need of all our citizens, it is the sense and the policy of this City Council that there be a complete and absolute moratorium on the construction or planning of any additional units of low-income housing;

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDERED:

That the City Manager notify all departments, boards, agencies and groups in the City of Cambridge of the policy as set forth in this order, and that all said units of our city government in particular the Department of Planning and Development, the Cambridge Redevelopment Authority and the Model Cities Administration be directed to coordinate their respective activities to the goal of developing an implementable Comprehensive Plan which establishes the long range police of the City of Cambridge in the area of Housing and Community Development.
