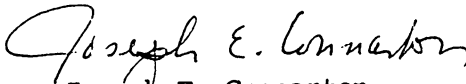

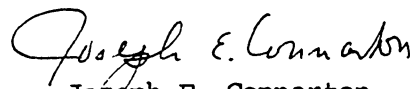

COUNCILLOR MYERS

- WHEREAS: Public housing residents in Cambridge often face problems related to poverty and isolation from the mainstream of society; and
- WHEREAS: When in crisis, such households often require a variety of services to avoid destabilization, with its subsequent potential for domestic violence, substance abuse and eviction from public housing; and
- WHEREAS: Since 1976 the Cambridge Housing Authority has operated a case management program to stabilize households in crisis, to assist them to access needed social services and to prevent the unnecessary eviction of such households; and
- WHEREAS: Under the current fiscal crisis, funding for this program and all other so-called "open-referral" programs funded by the Massachusetts Department of Social Services is being threatened with elimination; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council go on record expressing its support for continued funding of the Cambridge Housing Authority Homelessness Prevention Program, Line Item 4800-0250 in the state budget; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a letter to each member of the Cambridge delegation of the legislature and to the Chairpersons of the House and Senate Ways and Means Committees expressing the City Councils' strong support for this program.

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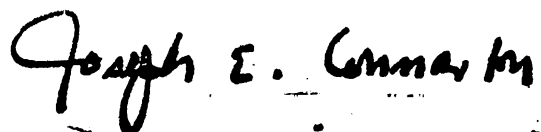
