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Dear Congressman O'Neill:

This is in further reference to your letter of January 23 to our Boston Regional Director in behalf of the Cambridge City Council who contacted you concerning the postal facility in East Cambridge.

The present post office in the East Cambridge section, known as "Cambridge C Branch", is leased until December 31, 1970, and provides 2,340 square feet of first floor space, 437 square feet of second floor space as well as 2,104 square feet of basement space for storage only.

Regional officials are currently seeking approximately 4,000 square feet of suitable space to serve the East Cambridge area. In view of the resolution of the Cambridge City Council, efforts will be undertaken immediately with the Middlesex County Commissioners to obtain postal space in the new Court House.

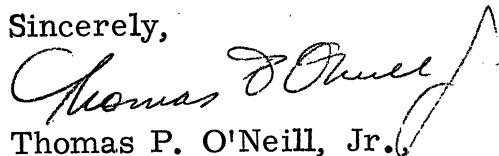
Dear Paul:
