for a permit to dump clean snow into tidewater, at the following locations, during the winter of 1946-47: Into Charles River, from the north and south sides between Warren Bridge and the Charles River Dam in Cambridge and Boston, except from the property of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; into Mystic River at Drains 7 and 8 of the Boston & Maine Railroad Bridges in Somerville, Everett and Medford; into Miller's River in Somerville; and into Boston Harbor from pier head between Freight Houses Nos. 46 and 47 of Mystic Docks, Charlestown, Mass.


