Nothing herein shall authorize or empower the Corporation to disburse any of its assets or earnings in a manner whereby part or all of said assets or earnings shall inure to the personal benefit of any of its members, nor shall the Corporation carry on propaganda, engage in any respect in political activity or attempt to promote or influence legislation.

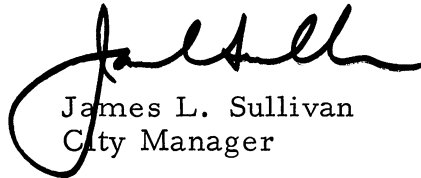
