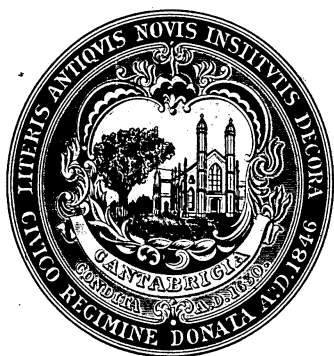

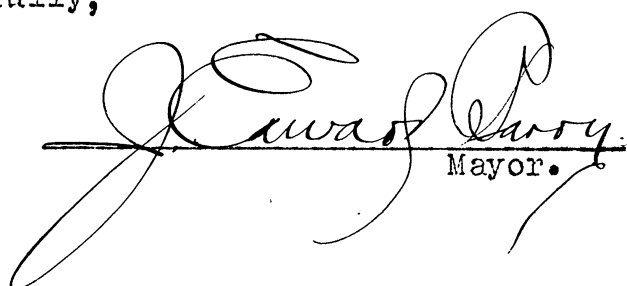

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN June 18, 1912.

WHEREAS:

James W. Emery, a veteran of the Civil War, employed in the Buildings Department of this city, who has been continuously employed in said service for upwards of seventeen years and is now physically incapacitated for further active service, has applied for retirement under the provisions of Chapter 447 of the Legislative Acts of the year 1912, it is

ORDERED:

By authority of said Chapter 447, that from and after the first day of July 1912, there be allowed and paid to the said James W. Emery, a pension of Six Hundred Dollars per year, payable in monthly installments, the same to be charged to the proper Building appropriations.
