COUNCILLOR W. SULLIVAN

- WHEREAS: The financial plight of the elderly citizens of Cambridge places them well below the poverty level; and
- WHEREAS: This City Council had previously voted to request the Cambridge Housing Authority not to increase monthly rent payments for elderly tenants; and
- WHEREAS: It has been brought to the attention of this Council that some tenants received increases of nearly 50%; and
- WHEREAS: Supplemental Security Income payments and general Social Security payments, although being increased slightly, have not been increased in proportion to these rent increases; and
- WHEREAS: The Cambridge Housing Authority has failed to gain the confidence of its tenants as well as the general public; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record requesting the Cambridge Housing Authority not to increase rental payments for the elderly tenants of the Authority during such a difficult period in our national economy.
