WHEREAS: July 31, 1993 marked the coronation of His Majesty Kabaka Ronald Muwenda Mutebi II, the 36th King of Uganda/Buganda; and

WHEREAS: His Majesty Kabaka Ronald Muwenda Mutebi II announced at his coronation his intention to be a "kabaka who leads," a "kabaka who works," and a "kabaka who listens to the will of his people"; and

WHEREAS: The ability to both lead ones people and to be led by one's people is the rare ability which is required of a great ruler; and

WHEREAS: The Ggwanga Mujje Association of Greater Boston, Massachusetts, in a celebration of Ugandan culture and traditions, is welcoming His Majesty Kabaka Ronald Muwenda Mutebi II to join our local community as it endeavors to rediscover its cultural values and traditions; and

WHEREAS: The theme of this important and inspirational visit is "Culture and Development," illustrating two themes of critical value to the Ugandan nation; and

WHEREAS: As part of his visit, His Majesty Kabaka Ronald Muwenda Mutebi II will attend a church service at Cambridge's St. Paul's African Methodist Episcopal Church on Bishop Allen Drive on Sunday, May 29, 1994; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That I, Kenneth E. Reeves, and this Cambridge City Council, do hereby offer our official welcome to His Majesty Kabaka Ronald Muwendi Mutebi II to Cambridge on behalf of all of the residents of Cambridge, and wishes him well as he leads the nation of Uganda for many years to come.
