RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Simpson family on behalf of the entire City Council.

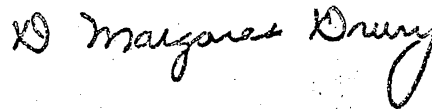

WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of Thomas Walter Simpson on February 9, 2007; and

WHEREAS: Thomas graduated from the former St. John Evangelist High School, Class of 1935. He then worked at Carters Ink and briefly studied mechanical engineering at Northeastern University before enlisting in the Navy Reserve in March 1941. On active duty, he received further engineering training at the Ford plant in Dearborn, Michigan, and then served in Utility Squadron 9 as an Aviation Mechanics Mate 1st Class in the South Pacific, repairing radio-controlled aircraft; and

WHEREAS: Thomas worked in the Government Printing Office in Washington, D.C. and then transferred to the Internal Revenue Service in Boston as a clerk. He completed a bachelor's degree in Business with a concentration in accounting, and then worked as an I.R.S. agent in the Field Audit and then Pension and Trust Division until retiring many years ago.

WHEREAS: Thomas had a range of hobbies including golfing, astronomy, stamp and coin collecting and music and dancing; and

WHEREAS: Thomas was a joiner who participated in a wide range of social groups, progressive causes, and Norwood town affairs. Among these were Norwood Squares, the Do-Si Dopers, Citizens Conservations Corps, Public Citizen, and Common Cause; and
