Community Boating is a not-for-profit public sailing organization located on the Boston side of the Charles River basin. We receive no state or federal funding and fully 74.9% of our funding comes from membership fees. It is our goal to make the pleasures of boating accessible to all. In addition to our Adult program, we also have a Junior program for kids aged 10-17 where more than 1500 participants learn to row and sail all summer for a fee of only \$1.00! Our membership is made up young and old, and all races and religions, and the majority come from Boston and Cambridge neighborhoods.

We would like the opportunity to provide information to Cambridge residents who may not be aware of our services. If it is at all possible, we would like to bring a Cape Cod Mercury 15' sloop and information on our organization, to several public neighborhood locations. Some locations that we feel would be high visibility are Cambridge Common and Harvard Square. Please let me know what the proper procedure for acquiring the necessary permits or permission is.
