In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred
and Seventy Seven,

An Ordinance in relation to the
boundaries of the several wards, and
the number of members of the Common
Council to be elected by each ward,

Be it ordained by the City Council
of the City of Cambridge, as follows:

Sec. 1. The boundaries of the several wards
shall, until the month of October in the
year Eighteen Hundred and Eighty two, continue
the same as now established.

Sec. 2. The members of the Common Council
shall be apportioned as follows:
Ward One shall elect four.
Ward Two shall elect six.
Ward Three shall elect four.
Ward Four shall elect four.
Ward Five shall elect two.
