WHEREAS:

As a result of this lack of security unauthorized persons have been roaming at will within the building, have been harassing the residents and have been damaging property both within the building and on the grounds, and

WHEREAS:

It is intolerable that our senior citizens should be forced to live in fear and insecurity, now therefore be it

ORDERED:

That the Housing Authority be requested to provide a 24-hour security personnel at the door of the Erie Street apartments and at the doors of all other elderly apartments managed by the Housing Authority, and be it further

ORDERED:

That the City Manager and the Chief of Police be requested to meet with the Housing Authority to ensure that this order is carried out, and be it further

ORDERED:

That the City Manager, the Chief of Police and the members and the Director of the Housing Authority report to the City Council in one week on what steps have been taken to make these buildings secure for our senior citizens on a 24-hour basis.
