### Robert DeGuglielmo, insurance agency head

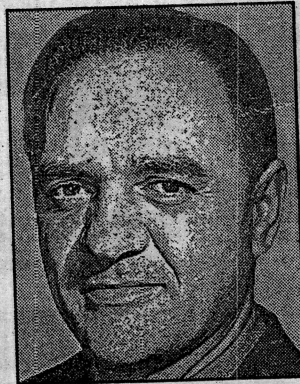
Robert R. DeGuglielmo Sr. of Cambridge, founder and president of DeGuglielmo Insurance Agency, died Friday at home after a lengthy illness. He was 74.

Born in Cambridge, he graduated from Cambridge Latin High School in 1934 and from Boston University in 1938, where he was voted most valuable player on the baseball team.

During World War II, Mr. DeGuglielmo served with the 1st Marine Division, landing on Guadalcanal and participating in campaigns on Roi-Namur, Saipan, Tinian and Iwo Jima.

He received the Bronze Star, two Presidential Unit Citations and six stars for various campaigns before his honorable discharge with the rank of major. Later, as a member of the active reserves, he was promoted to the rank of full colonel. He retired from active reserves in 1968.

Mr. DeGuglielmo founded the DeGuglielmo Insurance Agency, where he worked until his retirement in 1990. He also held various positions with East Cambridge Savings Bank, serving on the board of corporators, board of investments, board of trustees, senior vice president and honorary trustee.

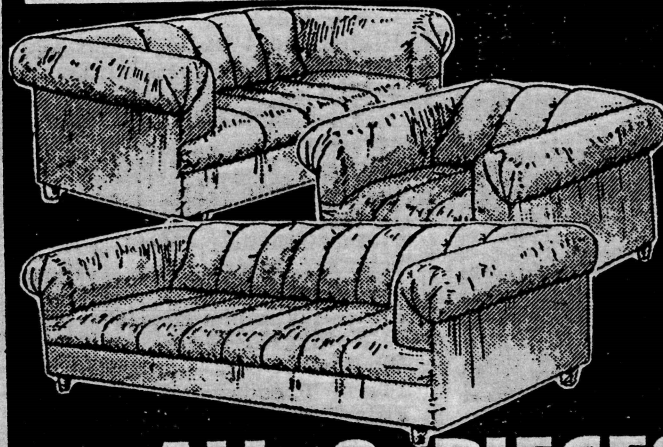
