IN BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN, }
May 3, 1871. }

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the public safety and convenience of the inhabitants require that Spruce street, between Cedar street and North Avenue, should be altered and widened:

It is therefore hereby

ORDERED, That due notice be given to the abutters on said Spruce street, and all other persons interested, that this Board intends to alter and widen the street before mentioned, by taking a portion of their land and laying out the same as a public street; and that due notice be given to all persons and parties owning or having any rights in estates that will be benefitted by the said proposed alteration and widening of said street, that this Board intends to assess a portion of the expense thereof upon the estates so benefitted according to law—and that
