IN BOARD OF MAYOR AND ALDERMEN,
November 8, 1871.

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the public safety and convenience require that Main Street, for the distance of about one hundred and fifty feet Southeasterly from the corner of Brookline Street, should be widened on the Southerly side:

It is therefore hereby

ORDERED, That due notice be given to the owners of the estates in the Brick Block, on Main street, next Southeasterly of Brookline street, and all other persons interested, that this Board intends to widen the Street before mentioned, by taking a portion of their land and laying out the same as a public street; and that
