IN CITY COUNCIL

ORDERED: That the Commissioner of Public Works be and hereby is authorized under the provisions of the General Ordinances, Chapter 17, Section 17-10 and all other applicable sections of Chapter 17, to grant a permit to Rob Everts of the Massachusetts Nuclear Referendum Campaign to set up a table at the Harvard Square Kiosk on October 9, 16, 23 and 30, 1982 in connection with the Nuclear Referendum Campaign which will appear as Question Number 3 on the November 2, 1982 election ballot; and be it further

ORDERED: That this permit is granted subject to whatever restrictions are imposed by the Commissioner of Public Works for the safety of the public and to insure the free passage of foot traffic in the area designated by him.
