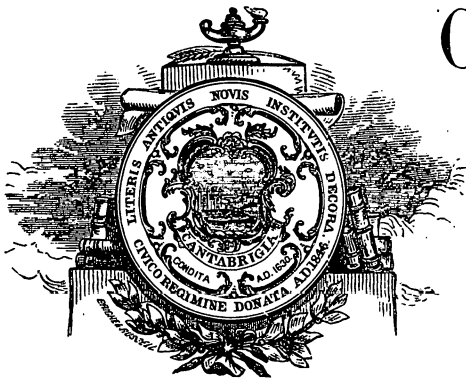




CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN,

April 22^d 1874.

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that

Willow Street

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land *thirty feet* in width between

Cambridge St. and the Somerville Line

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by

E. F. Bowker
Dated February 16, 1874

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that — damages be allowed for the land so taken ~~as aforesaid~~ *as*

Follows - To Catherine Powers Land 140 sq. ft. @ 35 cts. \$ 49.00.
Order - That thirty days be allowed for the removal of fences or other obstructions standing on the land so taken as aforesaid.
