In Board of Mayor and Aldermen, Nov. 12. 1862

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the safety and convenience of the inhabitants require that *Apple Avenue, so called, running from Broadway to Cambridge* Street should be *laid out as a public highway* -

it is therefore hereby Ordered, that due notice be given to *Isaac Livermore, Thomas Dana, Franklin E. Gregory, Hovey & Co., C. L. Harding, and any other persons, or persons interested,*

that this Board intends to *lay out* the Street before mentioned, by taking a portion of *their* land and laying out the same as a public street — and that *Wednesday, the twenty-sixth day of November at 2 1/2 o'clock, P. M.,* is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made thereto.
