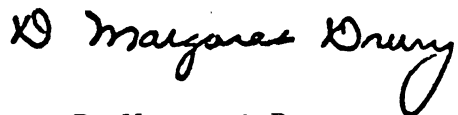

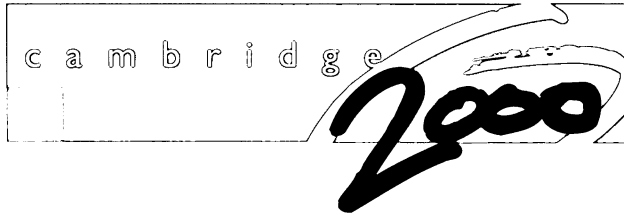

To the Honorable, the City Council:

I am hereby requesting the appropriation of \$17,691 from Property Taxes to the Human Services Salaries and Wages account (\$14,891) and Other Ordinary Maintenance account (\$2,800) to cover a portion of additional expenditures in the Mayor's Summer Youth Employment Program which were the result of the number of participants increasing from 401 in the previous two years to 506 in 2000. This increase is attributable to changes in federal legislation which resulted in severe funding cuts for youth services in the region and a movement away from stand-alone summer employment programs as well as reductions in state funding historically used to support youth programs in Cambridge.
