Edward L. Stewart, 88

Was principal of Scituate High

Edward L. Stewart, former principal of Scituate High School, died at Life Center of the South Shore in Scituate Monday. He was 88.

Mr. Stewart was born in Rockland. He attended public schools in Rockland and Bridgewater, where he excelled as an athlete. He graduated in 1932 from Boston College, where he lettered in football.

He began working for Scituate public schools in 1932, first as a teacher, then as a coach. He later became principal of the high school, and he served as superintendent of the school system for two years in the mid-1960s.

During World War II, he served with the US Navy on convoys in the North Atlantic. He continued in the US Naval Reserve, retiring in 1969 with the rank of commander.

In 1970, Mr. Stewart retired as principal. He coached many basketball, football, and baseball championship teams, and was elected to the Massachusetts High School Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1968.

After his retirement, he was an admissions representative for Assumption College in Worcester.

Mr. Stewart belonged to the Scituate Country Club, and won a golf championship when he was 67.

He leaves two daughters, Linda Wild of Scituate and Mary Jane Vailancourt of Salem; three sons, Edward L. of Pensacola, Fla., Peter of Plymouth and Michael of Scituate; 14 grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be said Saturday at 10 a.m. in St. Mary of the Nativity Church, Scituate Harbor.
