That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to direct the Director of Traffic and Parking to consider the possibility of extending the Resident Parking Sticker Program in Cambridgeport to the adjacent streets previously closed by the program in order to provide relief for the residents of these adjacent streets who are presently being restricted from the program.
