WHEREAS: **Gary Bellow's** name is synonymous with advocacy on behalf of people with limited financial resources; and

WHEREAS: While justice may be blind, the emerging truth of our legal system is that resources can determine who can have justice; and

WHEREAS: In his tenure as the Louis D. Brandeis Professor of Law and Faculty Director of Clinical Programs at Harvard Law School, **Gary Bellow** has carefully nurtured a generation or more of lawyers for poor clients. Lawyers who must understand the necessity of being a change agent if the quality of life available to the poor is to improve; and

WHEREAS: Professor **Gary Bellow** has made many important contributions to the Progressive Political lawyering movement over the past twenty-five years he has been a true leaders in the development of Clinical Legal Education and his impact has been felt wherever legal services are provided to the poor; and

WHEREAS: **Gary Bellow** you have given your life in Service to Americans who are not advantaged. You have gone into the fields in California and sent others to assist the plight of migrant farm workers. You have set up shop in Washington, D.C. and assured the provision of Legal Services for the poor. You have come to

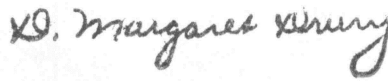
