- WHEREAS: To date there is only one Senior Center in Cambridge, the Cambridge Committee of Elders at 15 Pearl Street; and
- WHEREAS: In the Somerville Cambridge Elders Service (SCES) Survey, "Loneliness" was a serious problem for many seniors, and "a place to meet with friends" was an important need, and in fact, was listed the second most important need on this study; and
- WHEREAS: Both the Cambridge Living Options for Elderly (CLOE) and the Area Agency on Ageing concur with this finding; and
- WHEREAS: The Committee of Elders (COE) at 15 Pearl Street is being donated additional space by George Rothman in order to expand their existing limited facilities; and
- WHEREAS: COE's commitment to assisting the low-income and troubled elderly people, serving as an important link in the service network aiding the elderly homeless person, serving as a day center, meal program, housing assistance advocate, and general support as well as attempt to meet the socialization needs of the city's elders through activity programs, meals, trips, educational events and meetings; and
- WHEREAS: COE is centrally and ideally situated to meet the needs of the low-income elderly population, is a private, non-profit corporation capable of attracting a variety of sources of funds and has recorded success with the operation of the existing center and has the desire and now the facilities to grow; and
- WHEREAS: The COE would need \$60,000. to meet the costs of renovation and operational expenses for the first fiscal period and would require additionally \$30,000. of public funding on a yearly basis to maintain the program; now be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council request the City Manager to confer with the Assistant City Manager of Human Services to allocate \$30,000. to the Committee of Elders for this funding period, and to continue the same allocation on a yearly basis; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager report within the next two weeks on the possibility of this funding.

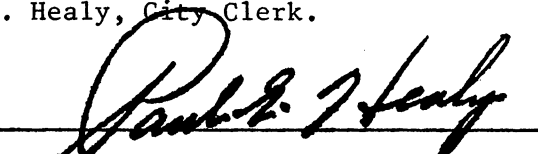
