Whereas it is deemed by this Board to be expedient to complete the sidewalks herein after named, by setting edge-stones,

Ordered, That the Superintendent of Streets and Drains be directed to complete the sidewalk on the Eastern side of Fifth Street, between Otis and Thornside Streets, and the sidewalks on Otis Street, between Fourth and Fifth Streets, by setting edge-stones, and that the expense of such edge-stones be assessed upon the abutters according to law.
