WHEREAS: The present conflict in the area of the Persian Gulf should, among other things, rekindle awareness of both our dependence upon and often wasteful use of energy and energy sources; and

WHEREAS: On the local level here in Cambridge, this waste is strikingly evident during the evening when a number of large buildings, office, business, educational, etc., are ablaze with lights and, when occasional inquiry is made as to why, given that there are no occupants in the buildings at certain hours, so much electricity is being wasted, the less than satisfactory response of "the system is automatic" is received; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this Council urges all Cambridge residents, and especially owners of large properties (office, business, educational) to take steps to cutback on the unnecessary use of electricity and other energy sources during hours when such cutbacks will not exert a negative impact on people or the work in which they are ~~in~~ involved; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and is requested to prepare and forward a copy of this Resolution to the Cambridge Chamber of Commerce with the request that the substance of its content be included in the Chamber's next newsletter. Further, the City Clerk is requested to forward copies of this Resolution to the Cambridge Chronicle and The Cambridge TAB for use as a public service announcement; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Manager request the Director of the city's Cable Television Office televise this plea for conservation of energy as a regular public service announcement and that this begin as soon as possible.
