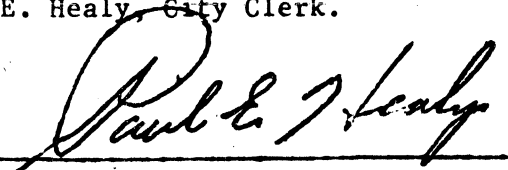
MAYOR DUEHAY

- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge has shown its commitment to memorializing John F. Kennedy with the renaming of Boylston Street in his honor; and
- WHEREAS: The Cambridge City Council in March of 1985 passed a resolution introduced by the late Mayor Leonard J. Russell urging the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to pass legislation making May 29th a state holiday to memorialize John F. Kennedy; and
- WHEREAS: This fall marks the 25th anniversary of JFK's election to the presidency, a career in public service that began in Cambridge in the 8th Congressional District; and
- WHEREAS: The bill for the John F. Kennedy holiday will be considered by the 1986 session of the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council hereby urges the Cambridge delegation to the state legislature to become sponsors of the bill in the 1986 session of the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to declare May 29th a state holiday to memorialize President John F. Kennedy; and be it further

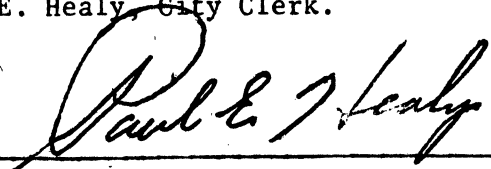
