- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of former Atlanta, Georgia Mayor Maynard Holbrook Jackson, Jr. on June 23, 2003; and
- WHEREAS: Maynard Jackson was the first African American to be elected Mayor of Atlanta, Georgia; and
- WHEREAS: Maynard Jackson earned his BA in Political Science and History from Morehouse College in 1956; and
- WHEREAS: Maynard Jackson received his J.D. from North Carolina Central in 1964; and
- WHEREAS: Maynard Jackson took his first political office in 1970 when he was elected Vice-Mayor of Atlanta, Georgia; and
- WHEREAS: Maynard Jackson was a senior partner at the law firm of Jackson, Patterson & Parks from 1970-1973; and
- WHEREAS: In 1973, Maynard Jackson, winning 59% of the vote, was elected Mayor of Atlanta, Georgia and took office in January of 1974; and
- WHEREAS: In 1974, Maynard Jackson was the recipient of the prestigious Jefferson Award for "the greatest public service performed by an American 35 years or under"; and
- WHEREAS: Maynard Jackson was the beloved son of Maynard Sr. and Irene (Dobbs) Jackson; and
- WHEREAS: Maynard Jackson's passing will leave a void in the lives of all his surviving family, his wife, Valerie, three daughters, a son and a stepdaughter; and
