Re your inquiry about mailing May 1, 1979 tax bills, it is planned to mail the bills during the first week in March, 1979. This will reflect activity in the real and personal property accounts through January 31, 1979

For your information, the law (Chapter 59, Section 57) states that if the second half of the tax is not paid by May 1, it will be subject to 10% interest from April 1. If a balance remains on the first half (at the time of the second mailing) interest accrues from October 1.

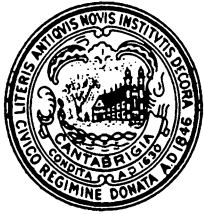

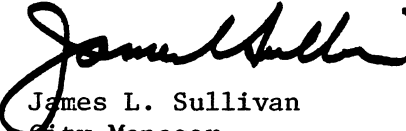
